Definitions:

- **radical**: favors rapid, fundamental change in existing social, economic, or political order; may be willing to resort to extreme means, even violence or revolution to accomplish such change (extreme change to create an entirely new social system)
- **liberal**: A person whose political beliefs tend to favor experimentation and change, reform of inequities, and an active role for the federal government in promoting individual welfare and supporting civil rights, and accepts peaceful political and social change within the existing political system
- **moderate**: political ideology that falls between liberal and conservative and which may include some of both; usually thought of as tolerant of others' political opinions and not likely to hold extreme views on issues
- **conservative**: The political outlook of favoring the cautious, traditional approach and a limited role for the federal government in helping individuals economically with more power to the states and supports the market economy with a potentially higher inequity in wealth. supports traditional values and lifestyles, favors a more active role for government in promoting national security, and approaches change cautiously
- **reactionary**: advocates a return to a previous state of affairs, often a social order or government that existed earlier in history (may be willing to go to extremes to achieve their goals)
- Trumpism: perhaps a newly emerging ideology that takes from several different values. It promotes traditionalism, nationalism and promotes radical cutbacks in immigration. Trumpism seeks to recreate the lost American culture of the 1950s: one which values fossil fuels, is run by deal makers who make money to achieve a GDP that can fund the niceties of American civilization, promotes protectionism to support American companies, and is united by race and class through shared material success. Trumpism supports the lowering of taxes, particularly on the wealthy job creators. In foreign policy, Trump wants an enormous military to directly protect American interests, but wants to withdraw from using the military for other purposes. Trumpism asserts that the world is a zero-sum game, and that even America's allies should be viewed as competitors.
